FROM THE PASTOR

Grieve, Pray, Remember

It's been difficult if not impossible to miss the events that have unfolded on the campus of Penn State University and the reaction that has been stirred. The events have confronted us, startled us, angered us, and grieved us via television, newspaper and every form of media available today. A prominent university with a generally good reputation, a storied football program with a legendary coach, a charity organization for under privileged kids, and then the disclosure of grievous behavior against those children, and no one—not one single person doing the right thing to report the tragic and illegal activities in a way that would expose the criminal behavior. How dreadful!

Sin, cover-up, and terrible, horrible, far-reaching and long-lasting consequences—it all has a very painful and familiar ring to it. See Genesis 3. To seek understanding and remedy for this contemporary event through the lens of Scripture, some may think is to miss the point, or to apply an inappropriate solution. But through Scripture is the only way to understand it, deal with it, and then continue life's journey.

When recently asked by one of our members about the events at PSU and what I thought, I responded first by saying it was tragic—a most heinous event that of all things presents particular evidence of the human need for the Savior Jesus.

We should grieve: for the children, for the perpetrators, for the PSU community, for every close and far-reaching negative consequence.

We should pray that truth and right prevail, that one series of bad choices does not lead to others, and that necessary changes are made regarding persons and systems to promote and support a the continuance of life and education.

And we should remember that *“all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.”* (Romans 3:23) It seems when something like this happens that gets major media exposure, it's easy to slip into a moralistic position that wants to throw the first stone. We need remember it was a pharisaical position that prompted the rebuke of Jesus of a group of religious leaders who wanted to stone a woman caught in adultery. As they discussed execution of justice, Jesus stood up and said to them, *Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her.* (John 8:7) Obviously the woman had sinned, had broken the law, and Jesus would deal with her (John 8:10, 11). But the message of Jesus also extends to the tendency of people, often religious people to self-righteousness—a holier-than-thou, I-would-never-do-such-a-thing judgment.

May the Lord heal the hurt and turn hearts to Himself where true peace and forgiveness is. May the Lord keep His people humble in the knowledge that God's grace is greater than all our sin, whether or not it's sin that makes the news or not.

For our sake God made Jesus to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (2 Cor. 5:21) Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. (2 Cor. 5:17) For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us. (Psalm 103:11, 12)

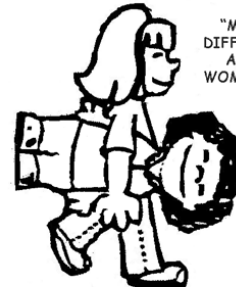

“I dropped out of high school, setting in motion a cycle of procrastination that eventually became a well-developed pattern in my life. Never having finished school, I falsified information on job applications and my resume. Eventually, I began to feel ashamed of myself and what I was doing. One day, I realized that it didn't have to be this way.

When I was in school, I didn't think I could measure up to the standards required of me academically. But I now believe that I can, through the power of Christ. God is a Finisher - He finishes what He starts. Now I want to finish what I started, too.

With my new desire to work for real change in many areas of my life, God began to make available to me tools and resources for the task at hand. The results are not evident, and my goal is close at hand. What joy it brings my heart, seeing something that seemed impossible now becoming possible!”

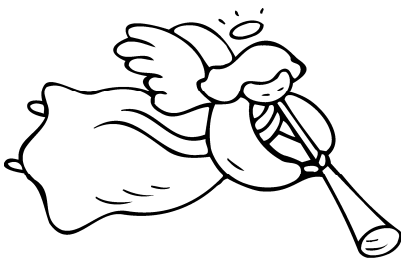
UPDATE FROM WHOSOEVER GOSPEL MISSION

SAVIOR ORNAMENT

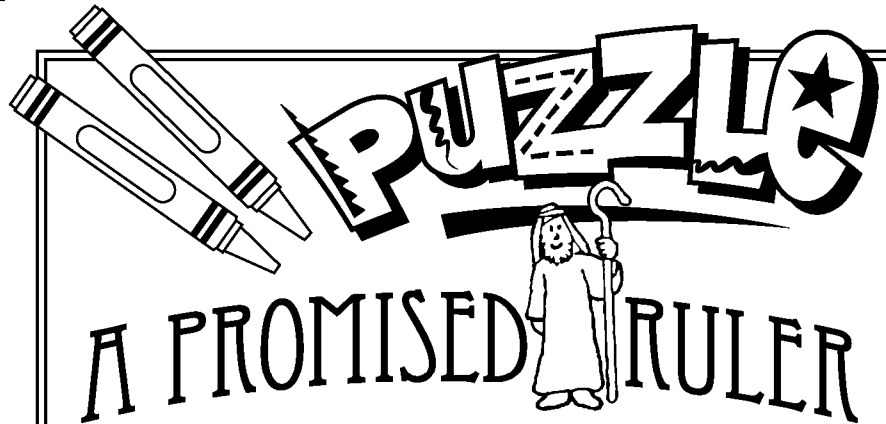
This Christmas, celebrate Jesus' birthday by making this keepsake ornament.

What you need:

- Wooden clothespin with round end
- Black permanent marker
- White cloth or felt
- Small wooden star (available at craft stores)
- Yellow paint
- Paintbrush
- Gold glitter (optional)
- Glue gun (and an adult)
- Straw-colored raffia
- Palm-size wicker wreath (available at craft stores)
- Ribbon

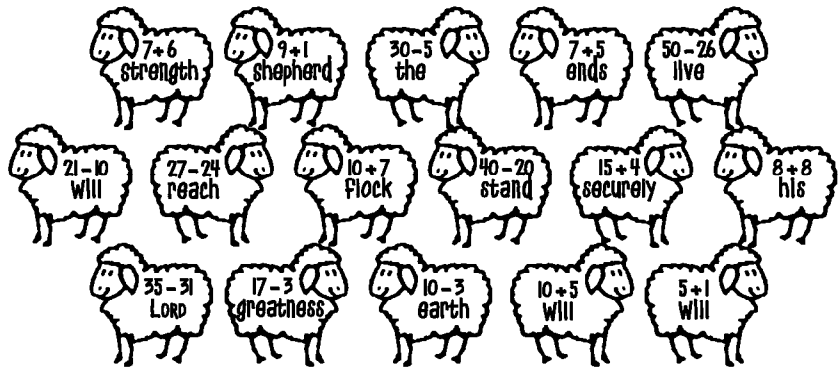
What you do:

1. On the clothespin's round knob, draw two dots for eyes.
2. Wrap the white cloth around the clothespin, like a swaddled baby.
3. Paint the star yellow; add glitter, if desired.
4. With the glue gun and adult supervision, glue the raffia to the bottom inside of the wreath. Then glue the swaddled clothespin atop the raffia and glue the gold star atop the wreath.
5. Tie a ribbon around the top, near the star.
6. Hang the ornament on your Christmas tree or tie it on a gift.

Covenant Agreement of Mission Support

The terms of our dismissal from the Presbytery of Philadelphia included a Covenant Agreement of Mission support payments to the presbytery in the amount of \$ 440,000, to be paid in installments of \$44,000 each year, over a period of ten years.

You have responded generously to this appeal, with contributions to the Covenant Agreement for Mission Support as of October 31, 2011, of \$42,471, which is truly an amazing response of generosity and thankfulness to God’s faithfulness.

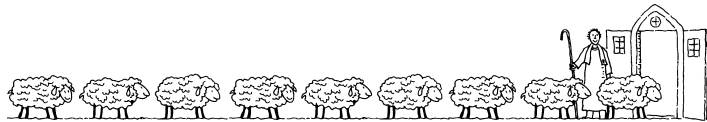

SHEPHERDING NEWS



Thank you to all who responded to the Congregational Shepherding Questionnaire this past summer. Of the 66 Questionnaires returned, the feedback was overwhelmingly positive, and there were some good suggestions. Many members of OEPC are ministering and being ministered to at a much deeper level than they ever have before. It's only been about a year since we began this ministry, and we feel we still have much room for improvement, but it is encouraging to know that many are being blessed by regular contact with their shepherds.

For those who are unfamiliar with this ministry, it might be good to give a general review of the Shepherding initiative. The Session takes the biblical mandate to shepherd (nurture) the flock at Oreland seriously. After nearly a year of exploring ways to do this, Session settled on the model of Shepherding teams of 3, consisting (ideally) of two Ruling Elders and one Deacon (not all teams have a full complement). We have about 15 teams, and each team picked about 15 members. Each Shepherding team has a goal of intentionally connecting regularly with each member of their flock as often as seems appropriate, but at least twice a quarter, to share, pray, and encourage them to a closer walk with Jesus and active participation in His Church. Shepherding teams meet monthly to review needs and pray for the flock. So while you may not know it, you are held up in prayer regularly.

If anyone has questions about this ministry or special prayer needs, please feel free to call the church office or one of the members of the Shepherding oversight team.

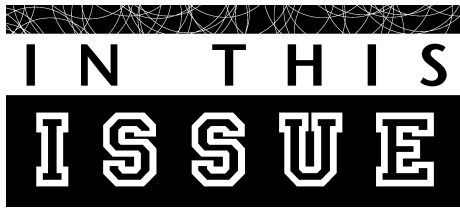
