Report from Timothy Ricci to the Session of Oreland Evangelical Presbyterian Church December 2010

Senior High: Advent is my favorite time of the ecclesiastical year. It is a time we look back on the incarnation of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and look forward to his glorious return at the end of history. This year in Senior High we have been focusing on how the advent, death and resurrection, and return of Christ gives purpose to our lives today. These past 3 months have been fantastic. There is noticeable spiritual growth in a number of our students. Each week our Sr. Highs are excited to be at youth group and have been attentive and engaging during the talks. We have been seeing anywhere from 20 to 33 Sr. Highs come out each week. I have noticed higher attendance since the weather has turned colder. We have had some exciting events such as Turkey Bowling, strobe light 4 square and cooking and serving Thanksgiving Day breakfast. On December 15th we had the Sr. High Christmas party. It was an evening filled with feasting, singing, a Christmas message, games and lots of laughter. Each and every Wednesday as my awesome leaders and I engage with our Sr. Highs I am newly amazed how our God uses us in the lives of our youth. Our leaders have been amazing each week. They come with energy and a strong desire to see our Sr. High grow in the grace and the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a true pleasure co-laboring with

them. I am thankful that God has called me to OEPC and that He has given me the awesome privilege of ministering to our youth. I have enjoyed teaching Sr. High Sunday School with John Hines this year. We are taking our students through a journey on Christian doctrine. Currently we are in a series on the doctrine of humanity.

Pepper: As I reported last month we are facing a demographic problem in Pepper. The good news is that seeing some 20 students moving from Pepper to Sr. High over the last two years we are seeing anywhere from 12 to 18 Jr. Highs come to Pepper each week. The bad news is that the vast majority (98%) are in 8th grade. This fall we (myself, leaders, and YMAT) have been praying and brainstorming ways to get 6th and 7th grade students involved. Once the new year commences we will put our ideas into effect and see what the Lord has for us. Please keep Pepper in prayer. We have a great group of Jr. High students. We are seeing spiritual growth in some of our students and other students beginning to open up about their lives, struggles, questions. God is at work in our Jr. Highs. Our Jr. High leadership is dedicated, creative and awesomely faithful. I am thankful for each and every one of them. Chilipepper (winter retreat) is January 14-16, 2011. We have been planning and praying since September and we are very excited to see what God will do.

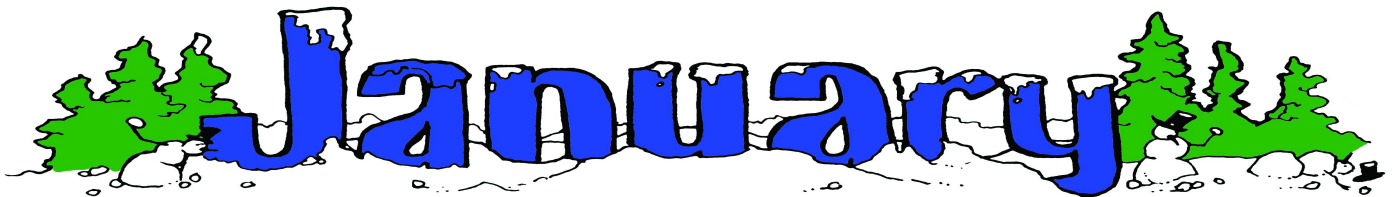

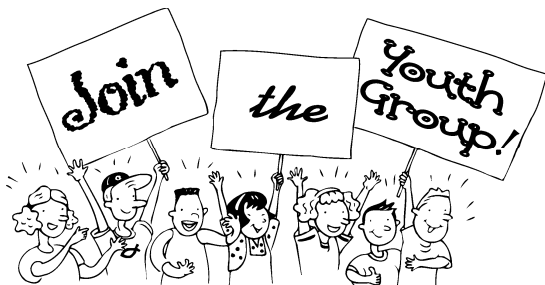

We count it such a privilege that God has called us to work with The JESUS Film Project® and we stand in awe of the amazing ways that He has chosen to use the film. It is no exaggeration to say that *every* day of this past year, someone in *every* country on earth had the opportunity to see the *JESUS* film in their own heart language. And depending on the country, up to 50% of those who watched it made a profession of faith as a result. God is changing lives, and with you, we have the honor of being a significant part of what He is doing!

Our job is to cast vision for financial partners who support the “operations side” of the ministry through our weekend briefing conferences. Just through the events held this last year, four new languages were completely funded, 26 other projects were partially funded and two more projects were completely funded.
