A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“What’s This Sabbatical Thing?” – Part 2

(This article is the continuation of last month’s Carillon article regarding Pastor Jim’s sabbatical leave, and addresses some of his personal plans and who will be handling responsibilities in the life and ministry of the church while he is away.)

When I requested and the Session approved my sabbatical leave, my request included that a small group of four elders assist in the planning, execution, and follow-up of the sabbatical. (Elders Les Brown, Larry Godley, Doug Lieberman, and George Major offered to serve) Preachers have been scheduled for all of the Sunday and Vesper services while I’m on leave. Three qualified counselors have agreed to be available for pastoral counseling. Elders and Shepherding Teams will attend to pastoral needs and visitation. The four elders mentioned above will serve to oversee the day-to-day life and ministry of the congregation. The ministry staff will have some extras to attend to, but are more than capable. Bethanne, our church administrator, is on top of things in the church office. I’m confident of good ministry throughout the life of the congregation while I’m away, and certainly encourage all the membership to stay faithful in worship and ministry. One of the congregational benefits of clergy leave is the opportunities for members to discover or rediscover more active participation because the pastor has stepped back. I encourage you to do this!

I will be reachable while on leave. Over the years you and I have developed relationships precious to me. You have allowed me to be involved in your lives in all kinds of situations, and I want to remain your pastor in those particular pastoral times. I’m also trusting that we will have more life and ministry to share when I return. And so to that end, I want to serve you in those difficult times of pastoral emergency; for instance, at the time of a death that may arise while I’m on leave. With the help of the elders assisting me to plan this leave the following statement was prepared:

Pastor Jim is on a Session approved clergy leave from July 4 through October 9. He will return to the church and pastoral duties on Monday, October 10, and resume preaching on Sunday, October 23. During this leave-time he is not to be contacted or perform any OEPC pastoral duties, or any other preaching/teaching ministry in any other place. If during this leave-time you need pastoral counsel, please contact the church office for the names of pastoral counselors who have agreed to be available to OEPC members. In the event of the death of an OEPC member, (1) another pastor can be made available for care and funeral services; (2) a memorial service can be scheduled with Pastor Jim for after he returns; or, (3) Jim has expressed the desire to be contacted and if in the vicinity will make every effort to return to perform funeral services. In the event of other needs for pastoral care, Shepherding Teams are available, and may be reached through the church office. During Pastor Jim’s leave, any other pastoral, church-life, or ministry related concerns may be directed to an Elder-oversight team: Les Brown, Larry Godley, Doug Lieberman, and George Major.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR CONT'D

Kathy and I are in the process of planning our leave time to include some of the following: In July we will travel to visit family in Texas. We have decided to drive this time since there are no time constraints, and take in some of the beautiful sites of our country. We will spend some time in the Great Smoky Mountains on the way back home. In the beginning of August we will be in the northeast for some R&R and will take a weekend to attend the Farrell Reunion, which I have not done in several years. On August 7th, Kathy and I will celebrate our 35th wedding anniversary. God has blessed us with a trip to Ireland and Scotland August 15 to September 5. Being of Irish decent I've always wanted to see the place of my ancestors and to visit the "home of Presbyterianism" in Scotland. It will be an experience of a lifetime for Kathy and me! From the beginning of September until we return in October we expect then to be in the northeast for R&R. It is my intention during this leave time to connect with a counselor/mentor who will assist me and hold me accountable to some personal and intentional work on the repurposing of God's call to ministry.

The concept of a sabbatical leave is connected to the idea of Sabbath rest, which we know that the Bible instructs Christians to observe. We do this on the Lord's Day each week, but there is also the counsel of God's word for extended periods of quiet, rest, and reflection. In some ways, I suppose that 30 years of ministry has caught up with me in the sense that an extended time away will provide opportunity to rest and recreate, but also to reconnect relationally and devotionally, with God and family and friends, and in the process repurpose daily life and routine that is not so consumed by ministry.

Your encouragement as I head into this time has already been a blessing. The generosity of many people in a variety of ways toward various aspects of this leave has also been incredible! Your prayers have been most welcome and will be very important as God works on, around and within Kathy and me as we are on this leave.

We will be intentional to share our time and experiences upon our return. We will also want to hear what God has done in your lives and at OEPC while we were away. It is my hope that members, leaders, and staff will be blessed in my absence to realize that God has given you great measures of His grace in many wonderful ways for the life and ministry of this congregation. May His grace be abundant upon you. I look forward to discovering what God will do in all of us while we are apart for a season.

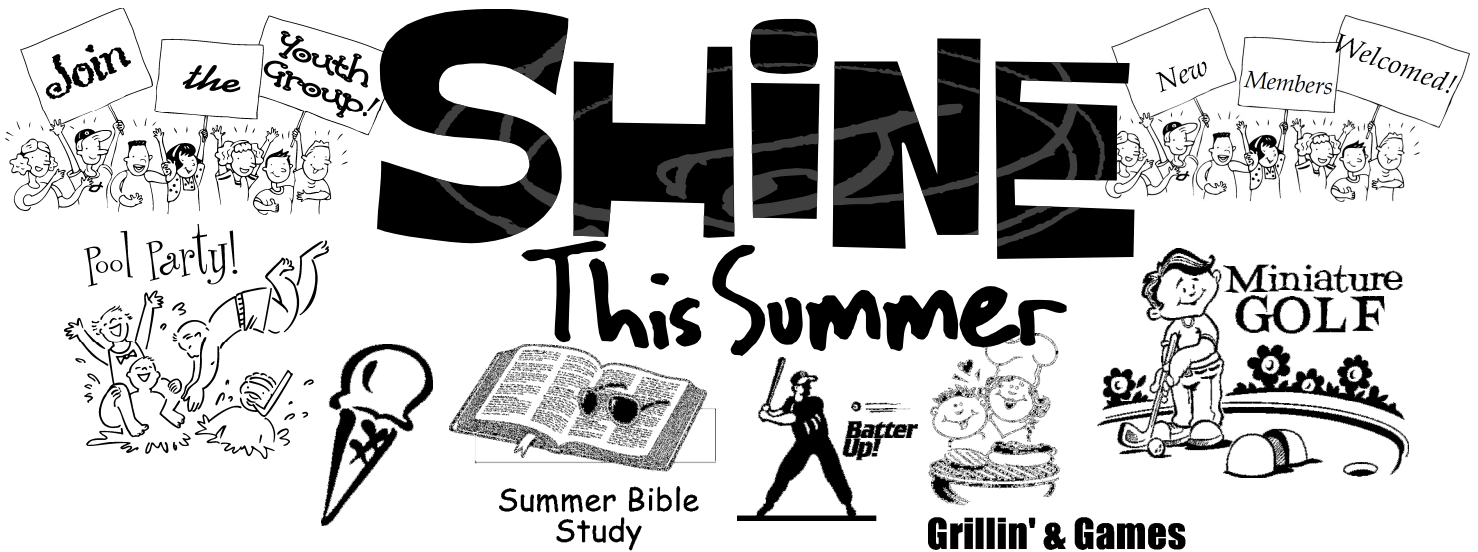
Missionary Retreat Fellowship, nestled in the mountains of Northeastern Pennsylvania, seeks to provide affordable housing for missionaries on home assignment. Founded by Bob and Bess Butters, MRF was incorporated in 1965 to serve all evangelical missions. It is non-profit, evangelical, and interdenominational.

While priority for homes is given to missionaries and missionary appointees, others involved in full time Christian work are also considered if there are vacancies. Bookings may be made for up to a year with extensions possible, depending on special needs and availability. In year 2010, 44 missionary families made use of the 8 homes, the most ever. Many were short stays during the Summer months but once the school year started, there were missionaries from Bermuda, Ecuador, Costa Rica, Mexico, Poland, Islamic Republic of Mauritania, Belgium and Colombia. With the exception of one home, which becomes vacant in September, the bookings calendar is full into 2012.

- ◆ Pray for strength and good health for all involved in transition for missionaries to and from the mission field and for the many travel details that have to be in place.
- ◆ Pray that MRF will continue to be the place of rest and renewal that many missionaries need.
- ◆ Thank the Lord for His blessing on this ministry for over 45 years of existence. No funds have ever been needed to be borrowed and all needs have been met to assist missionaries in establishing a home base for their home assignment or pre-field ministry period.

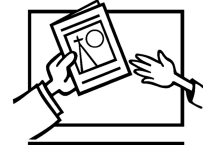

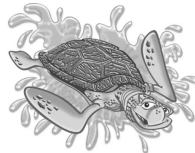

Covenant Agreement of Mission Support

The terms of our dismissal from the Presbytery of Philadelphia included a Covenant Agreement of Mission support payments to the presbytery in the amount of \$ 440,000, to be paid in installments of \$44,000 each year, over a period of ten years.

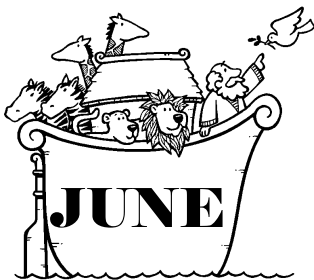
