EPC GENERAL ASSEMBLY, JUNE 22-25, 2011

Hope Presbyterian Church Cordova, Tennessee

The theme of the General Assembly meeting this year was Transformation, and the scripture reference was taken from 2 Corinthians 3:18,

“And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image”

It would be hard to imagine anyone who attended this incredible event not being positively transformed for the service of our Lord and Savior. From the initial Assembly Workshops (that were moderated by Ed Stetzer, focusing on the extensive research he had conducted among more than 7,000 protestant churches) through the business sessions, God’s presence was ever felt. The setting was magnificent, as we enjoyed the full campus of Hope Presbyterian, including an auditorium that seated over 5,000 and an audio and visual system that could rival any contemporary concert hall. The unofficial minutes are posted on the EPC website (www.epc.org) along with an interview with Ed Stetzer. The audio of all the morning and evening worship services and all of Dr. Stetzer’s workshops and question and answer sessions are in our library and available on CD for your listening pleasure. Some of the highlights from the 4 day gathering are here for your review:

- ◆ The workshops by Ed Stetzer were centered on transforming our churches to more of a missionary mentality and how we should be leading people to serve and not just to be customers of the church – “Co-laborers vs. Customers”
- ◆ A record number of attendees was gathered at Hope Presbyterian Church
 - ◆ 215 Teaching Elders
 - ◆ 245 Ruling Elders
- ◆ The work of the World Outreach ministry was highlighted and the 47 missionary units that are located in all corners of the globe (23 different countries) were held up in prayer.
 - ◆ The mission work in Kazakhstan was recognized as being in its 18th year of existence and for how they have raised up six additional churches and now established a presbytery, the Association of Reformed Churches of Kazakhstan, now completely leads by Kasak people.
- ◆ Several descending overtures were presented, including 10-A which refers to the EPC position of ordination of women. It was voted on to “...leave this decision to the Spirit-guided consciences of particular congregations...”; however, subsequent to this vote it was brought back up to the assembly floor and agreed that further time was needed to study this more closely.
- ◆ There were 25 new churches welcomed into EPC from all parts of the country
- ◆ There were also two new presbyteries – Presbytery of the Pacific and Presbytery of the Alleghenies – that were formed to allow for greater continuity of resources and regional cultures.
- ◆ Each session was opened in prayer by a chaplain from one of the branches of the armed services. This was another of the truly memorable aspects of the proceedings.

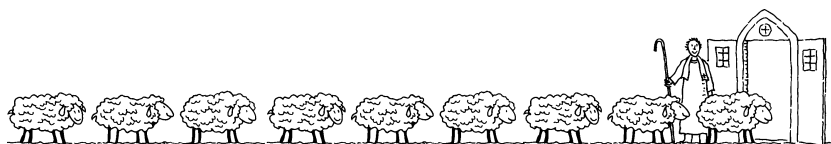
EPC GENERAL ASSEMBLY (CONT'D)

- ◆ Dean Weaver, chair of the New Wineskins Transitional Presbytery Committee, presented the plan around the dissolution of New Wineskins and the approach for how the remaining New Wineskins churches will be transitioned into the EPC.
- ◆ Jackie Gatliff, Director of Women in Ministries, spoke about the important roles women play in ministry and referenced the R.E.A.L. training programs that are being conducted around the country (POTE training will be at OEPC October 14-15.).

These are just some of the highlights and by no means are they an exhaustive review of the events. What is hard to characterize in words was the spirit of unity in our Lord and Savior, the true southern hospitality of all the members of Hope and the EPC, and the incredible meals that were so graciously prepared and served. Finally it would be an omission beyond acceptance to not acknowledge the music ministry that was integrated into every part of each session – Bruce Carroll and the entire music staff are incredibly talented professional and what they added was as if from angels.

Our church corporate is strong and vibrant and fully dedicated to the preaching, teaching and mission of God's word as it is written in the Bible – Amen.

Money is a test of Faithfulness

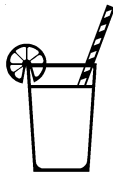

This year OEPC's youth ministry did camp differently, we were part of a combined junior and senior high camp with Student Life at the Tuscarora Conference Center in Mt. Bethel, PA. On August 1st 29 students, 6 youth leaders, and myself set out for an amazing week of worship, bible study, prayer, and lots of summer fun. There were 500 students at the Student Life camp. This was a week that most of our youth described as "the best camp ever!" All the buildings were air-conditioned, the food was good (especially the "blue juice"), all of the morning and evening sessions were professionally done, the snack bar was well stocked, and there was plenty to do.

What made camp so special is that from the first large group worship service it was clear that God was going to do something amazing in the lives of our youth. Many of our youth who were Christians were touched by God and have come back from camp with an intense desire to serve Christ faithfully. Many of our youth who were not Christians before they went to camp were confronted with the Gospel and 8 students made professions of saving faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. It was evident all week that the Holy Spirit was at work during morning devotions, morning worship, group recreation, afternoon bible study and prayer, evening worship, and church group time. It was such a blessing to see our students open up about where they were with God and to hear and be part of the awesome work God was doing in their hearts. 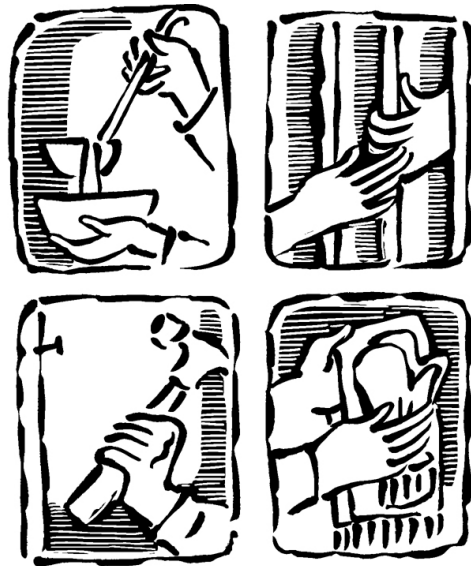
COLLECTION TRAILER

Special Guest Speaker Jacky Gatliff, Director, EPC Women In Ministry

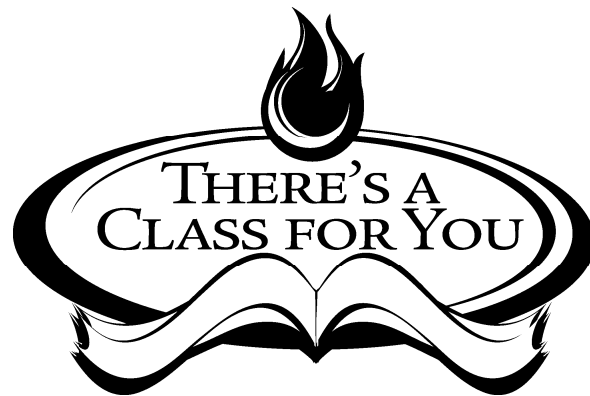
