PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Introduction: On Wednesday evenings during this year's Ice Cream Inspirational, Tim Ricci, our Director of Youth Ministry, has been doing a great study on Christian Apologetics. We have been learning about how Christians are to *"always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you."* (1 Peter 3:15) We have learned about "worldviews" and particularly about the Christian Worldview and how the work of apologetics is grounded in a Christian Worldview.

What appears below is my attempt to view a current political event through a Christian Worldview. It is important that Christians view the world and the events around us through the lens of Holy Scripture for the purpose of understanding it, as well as critiquing it. The article below was published as a "letter to the editor" in the Tuesday, August 3 edition of the Intelligencer Newspaper.

I encourage you to the work of Christian Apologetics with the people and in the places of your life and work. To God be the glory!

"If It Were Only That Easy!"

Let's think this through. The President recently signed yet another bill—the Improper Payments Elimination and Recovery Act. According to the newspaper article I was reading, the purpose of the bill is to keep government agencies from over-paying for services. "Every agency in our government will be required to conduct annual assessments (note "required") to determine which of their programs are at risk of making improper payments."

Think of it this way, it would be like you establishing a committee to determine where and when you might be over-charged, perhaps at the grocery store or, over-charged by any bill collector. In explaining the purpose of the bill, Mr. Patrick Murphy, who sponsored the bill said, "If the families around their kitchen table in Bucks County get doubled billed for their car payments or for their groceries, they're not going to stand for it... Their going to get their money back, and that's what this bill does."

Let's think this through; a new piece of legislation is going to keep people and groups from over-charging other people and groups. An annual assessment of the possibility of being over-charged is going to guard people and groups against being over-charged. This piece of legislation is going to cause people and groups to be outraged at being over-charged, and ultimately get peoples' money back! In addition, the President said that this piece of legislation will provide the tools to help the government reduce improper payments by \$50 billion dollars by 2012.

If it were only that easy! If the reduction of over-payment was only as easy as creating and signing a piece of legislation! If prompting people to be enraged at injustice and inequity was only as easy as passing a law telling them they should be! If prohibiting wrong business practice was only as easy as crafting and signing a new piece of legislation!

SHEPHERDING MINISTRY

Let's think this through. No Improper Payments Elimination and Recovery Act will eliminate improper payments or recover money spent when perpetrators mean to cheat the public. Regardless of how much or how thorough human assessment of potential fraud, all our assessing is flawed by the very same stuff that causes the need for such assessment. People and groups who wish to over-charge will over-charge, and, they will exercise every means at their disposal to get away with it.

The answer is not additional legislation. No additional laws are necessary. The Good Lord established law that remains applicable: "You shall not steal" and, "you shall not bear false witness against your neighbor" are two. These seem to cover rather succinctly and thoroughly the very matters at issue.

Let's think this through. Who would ever think human legislation more effective than the Creator's to move people toward honest and true behavior? If it were only that easy! Can we not see the futility in this, and in the creation of groups to assess the need for it? Probably, at some point, the creation of yet other groups to assess the work of the groups doing the assessing will be deemed necessary. Can you imagine the escalating cost of this legislation? The "savings" asserted in the first place would certainly be lost.

Only the arrogant and the idolatrous assert the authority of human ways and ignore the ways of God. (See commandment #1 - "You shall have no other gods before me.")

All this kind of legislation is not governing or leading the people. It's proclaiming false hope. It's wasting money. How about we do this: *Yet even now, declares the Lord, return to me with all your heart... Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and he relents over disaster.*" (Joel 2:12-14)

UPDATE FROM TEDD LODES

August 4, 2010

"The best missionary is the Bible in the mother tongue..."

We moved **English Class C** from a Mon/Tues/Wed schedule to a Mon/Wed/Fri schedule, but he didn't get the memo. I was looking forward to having the night off last night (Tuesday), but as I approached the house after taking the dogs for a walk, there he was, leaning against the door and knocking.

I took a deep bummed-out breath when I saw him from a distance (*no class tonight, I thought, we should be having this night off, but since he didn't know, I'll go ahead and teach him*).

Surprisingly, I didn't have such a bad attitude about a change-of-plans like I normally would (thank You, Holy Spirit), so despite my bummed-out-ness, I was in a pretty cheerful mood. I put the dogs in the back of the house and let him in.

"There class...um...yesterday? Um...in the night?"

"Yes, we had class last night," I responded.

"Oh," he smiled awkwardly, "I could not come...problems...in my home." "My mother no understand me."

We talked some more (he insisted on keeping the conversation in English, but it was a bit of a Spanglish dialogue). He told me how he's never felt so lonely before. He's sad, he's depressed, he's confused, and no one understands him. He actually expressed very clearly in English that his "heart is empty."

Are you kidding me? You mean this guy's gonna walk right in here and hand me an opportunity to talk about Jesus, just like that? This is what English Language Ministry is

all about, and how exciting to see its purpose taking form in such a practical, wonderful way...but you know what? I'm not very good at this stuff! (Ironic, huh?)

I told him that Jesus has given me peace, joy, and comfort when I've been sad, and that I have a relationship with Him and He's changed my life. I suggested that he talk to God and read the Bible, because the Bible can bring light to his heart, because it has truth. "Really?" he asked. "Yes! The Bible is alive, active, and can bring light to your heart."

"Oh, I no have," he said.

"You don't have a Bible?"

"No."

Well, I got up from my chair and grabbed a Spanish NIV New Testament Bible that a short term team had donated (THANKS GUYS!!), and handed it to him. "But if I give it to you, please read some of it." He was delighted!

"Really?!? I cannot accept."

"Yes you can! See," I wrote his name on the front page, "it has your name in it, so it's yours." He was all smiles. "I will read tomorrow," he said, "I promise."

We talked some more and when he left I told him we would pray for him. Please pray with me, those of you who feel lead. He has an empty heart that's searching desperately for purpose and peace, and the only One who can satisfy his heart is Jesus Christ. The first time we met him, he was drunk; I think it's because he's depressed and looking for comfort. Please pray that he'll read the Bible and that the Holy Spirit will reveal Christ to him as he reads the holy Scripture.

PHARP

PHARP (Peace-Building, Healing and Reconciliation Programme) is an international Christian NGO (non-governmental organization), registered and headquartered in Kenya and registered in Rwanda and the Sudan. Its operations extend beyond Kenya, Rwanda and the Sudan to Burundi, Democratic Republic of Congo, Tanzania and Uganda.

PHARP envisions society living in harmony with God, other human beings, and the physical environment through individual and community transformation. Its mission is to foster Godly peace, healing and reconciliation in hurting communities through programs on conflict transformation and post-conflict reconstruction. It seeks several objectives as part of this mission:

- ◆ To increase the knowledge and awareness of the root causes, reality, and results of violent conflicts in Africa.

- ◆ To serve as resource for training on mediation for those seeking to work in peace-building, healing, and reconciliation in Africa.
- ◆ To establish sustainable networks with organizations in the fields of reconciliation, non-violent conflict transformation, and organizational development.
- ◆ To conduct research on issues related to peace and transformation of individuals and communities.
- ◆ To produce peace, healing, and reconciliation materials.

Through its program strategy of participatory approaches, PHARP seeks to build community ownership and sustainability of conflict transformation and post-conflict reconstruction programs. The organization's major focus is training trainers on peace-building, trauma healing, reconciliation, discipleship and conflict transformation. Towards that end, PHARP engages in the following major activities:

- ◆ Conducting training workshops and seminars in conflict management, counseling, peace, and reconciliation.
- ◆ Researching the background, impact, and management of conflicts.
- ◆ Building capacity among local communities for peace, reconciliation, community reconstruction, and income-generating ventures.
- ◆ Educating through print and electronic media and the production and distribution of promotional materials and training and resource manuals.
- ◆ Providing a resource center of books, videos, journals, manuals, periodicals and leaflets on peace-building, healing and reconciliation.

FROM BETH JENKINS, OEPC DIRECTOR OF MUSIC

PREPARATION

Preparation is part of and necessary in every area of our lives. We prepare a meal, a precursor to eating it; we prepare for a test by studying in order to score well when taking it; we set our alarm clocks to assure enough time to prepare ourselves for the upcoming day; a woman's body prepares to carry a baby before and during her pregnancy with the goal of providing a nurturing environment in which her child can grow and subsequently be born strong and healthy; athletes prepare to contend by warming up and stretching their bodies to enable them to compete successfully and safely; singers (Worship Choir, Children's Choir, Christmas Choir) and musicians (Bells of Praise, Chime Choir, Praise Band, instrumentalists) practice and rehearse in preparation for leading in worship on Sunday mornings; the Worship Choir prepares for rehearsal by singing warm-up exercises which enable their bodies, minds, spirits and voices to focus and prepare to sing more effectively and safely.

In Advent we prepare for Christmas (Christ's coming to earth as a human), as well as for Christ's second coming in the future, and we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit into our lives to guide, instruct, and work the process of sanctification in us. In the season of Lent we prepare for and reflect on Christ's death and sacrifice for us, looking forward to His glorious resurrection.

Without preparation the end result is not as favorable, and sometimes fails all together -- the meal is a flop or does not get to the table early enough to be eaten; the test is failed and we don't truly learn the material; we awake late and do not have time to adequately prepare for the day (forget our lunch, forego a shower, begin the day foggy-brained, etc); we do not compete well in athletic competition and perhaps become injured; we come to rehearsal or worship ill- prepared in our minds, bodies, spirits, voices and knowledge of the music which hinders our worship and leading others in worship.

The Music Ministry at OEPC provides a special time 5-10 minutes before each service on Sunday mornings for worshippers to prepare their hearts and minds for worship. This time is for prayer and Scripture reading; a time to put other thoughts and concerns aside and focus on worshipping God. We need this time, and if we do not take this time before the service begins, we are preparing during the service and are not truly ready to worship until later in the service, missing the full blessing of and participation in the worship service.

Perhaps you've never come early enough to prepare for the service --you don't know what you're missing! I invite you to turn over a new leaf this month, give it a try, and reap the blessings.
